The Board has decided to eliminate the Board Minutes from Dock Talk. To communicate Board action to the membership, I will write a monthly column in DockTalk containing highlights of the Board meeting. A copy of the Board Minutes will continue to be available on the bulletin board in the Clubhouse and on the Web-site.

There is a correction to the edited version of the May 13, 2003 Board Minutes which appeared in Dock Talk. The Board did not authorize the repair of the Clubhouse awnings at a cost of \$3512.17. Member volunteers are repairing the awnings.

REPORT OF THE JUNE BOARD MEETING



A permit from the Dept. of Fish and Game is still needed for our rip rap project. We are hopeful it will be obtained in July. City Parks and Rec. Dept. has agreed to be the lead agency in our permit pursuit.

Response to the silent auction lien sale boats has been disappointing. Some public announcement or advertisement may be necessary.

Al Farnum presented the FBLI Board Report from their 6/9/03 meeting. It was comprised of the proposed lease with Western California Yacht Sales, a letter of interest in leasing the property from Jim Coddington of Pac-West Yacht Sales, and a recommendation from the FBLI. Jim Coddington spoke of his prior association with Stockton Yacht Sales when they were the lessee and his familiarity with the property. Following much discussion the Board decided to take the recommendation of FBLI and proceed with the Wescal Lease negotiation. The proposed lease with Wescal was modified to a three-year term, with one extension of two years.

John Dorothea and Phil Hendrix presented the bar report for mixed drinks and wine sales which shows a profit margin of 28.7%. The Board feels it necessary to hire an employee to tend to the clubhouse. Susan McLain is to hire a part-time regular employee to fill the job description provided by the procedures manual.

Members are requested to identify their personal property being stored at Purrfect Point.

The Board has reserved the Stockton Golf and Country Club on January 17, 2004 for the Installation of Officers and Awards Banquet.

Changes to Rules and Policy

Rules - Dog Rule - All current text under Item 7 is stricken. The recommended text is as follows:

7. Since the club is located within the city limits, all

pets and their owners shall be subject to Stockton City Ordinances. Pet owners shall be responsible for their animal's conduct at all times.

- a. Dogs shall be on a leash and under the control of a responsible person at all times.
- b. Any animal deemed aggressive or a nuisance by club management shall be restricted from club premises.
- c. Any incidents regarding animals should be reported to the harbormaster. The penalties for violating the rules will be determined by the Harbormaster or the Board of Directors depending on the severity of the case. The Board of Directors shall be notified by the Harbormaster of all reported incidents. (First Reading).

Policies - End Ties - All current text is stricken. Recommended text is as follows:

The use of end ties shall be determined by the Manager. End tie berthing arrangements may be temporary and at the discretion of the Harbormaster/Facility Manager. A and B dock end ties will remain open in order to provide flexibility to the Harbormaster/Facility Manager with regard to maintenance operations, member services and club events. (First Reading).

The dates for the Bay Cruise have been changed to August 9th through August 15th to enable our cruisers to be accommodated at some of their favorite ports. Contact Jim Pinkowski for more details. *[There has been some confusion regarding the Bay Cruise dates. As of this time the planed dates are Aug. 2nd - 8th. 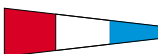

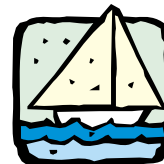

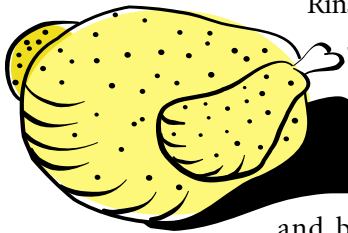


Farley's Galley

Corona Chicken

This delicious chicken dish can be made easily in any galley. All you need is a one-burner stove. If you are going out for the weekend most of the ingredients can be prepared at home and placed in zip-lock bags.

- One Chicken about 3-lbs.
- 1/4 cup Vegetable Oil
- 2 cups Cream of Coconut
- About 1 cup Corona Beer
- 1 medium Onion, chopped
- 1 Green Bell Pepper, chopped
- 1 Jalapeno Pepper, chopped
- Salt and Pepper to taste



Rinse chicken and pat dry. Cut into serving pieces. Heat oil in a Dutch oven or any pot with a lid that will hold all the ingredients over medium heat. Add chicken and brown on all sides. Remove

chicken and pour off all oil except 2 tablespoons. Return chicken to pot, then add cream of coconut and beer. Cover and simmer about 30 minutes.

Add onion, bell pepper, jalapeno pepper and salt and pepper to taste. Simmer about 20 minutes more, until liquid has been reduced to a gravy. If the liquid dries before chicken is done, add more beer.

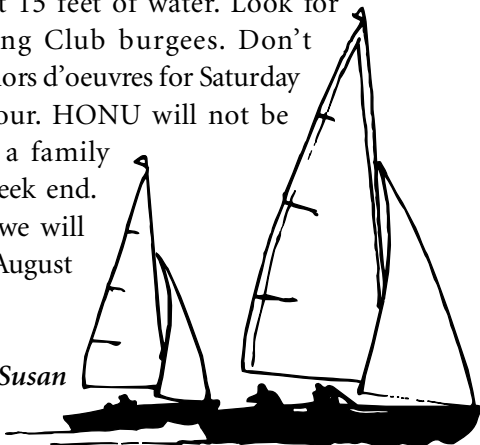

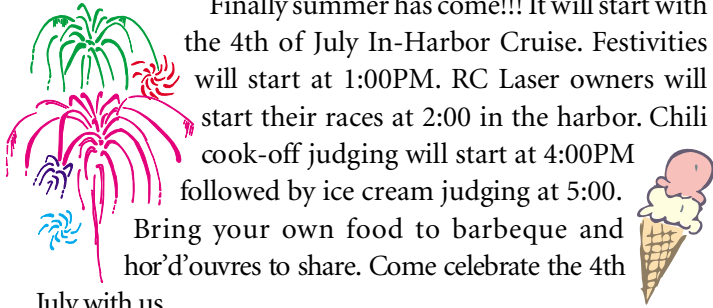

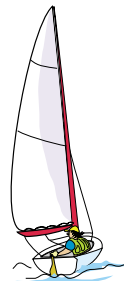

...like sand, the dollars slip through our fingers!







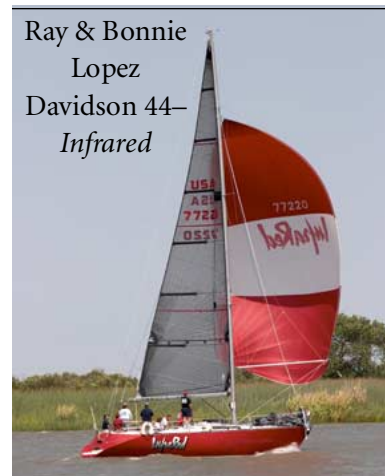

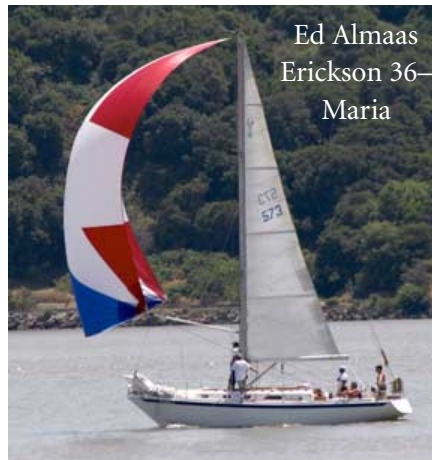
