Shrimp

Jambalaya

- 2 to 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- 1/2 cup chopped celery
- 2 jalapeno peppers chopped, stems and seeds removed
- 1/4 pound diced ham
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 3 large tomatoes, coarsely chopped
- 1/4 cup chopped parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 cup uncooked rice
- 3/4 pound shrimp, peeled and deveined (CostCo)

1/2 cup chopped green onion

Heat oil in a large wok over low heat stir in onion, green pepper, celery, jalapeno peppers, ham, and garlic. Cook over medium heat about 5 minutes, or until onion is tender, stirring occasionally.

Stir in chicken broth, tomatoes, parsley, salt, pepper, thyme, cayenne pepper, and bay leaf; cover and bring to boiling.

Add rice gradually, stirring with a fork. Simmer, covered, for 20 minutes, or until rice is tender.

Mix in shrimp and green onion. Simmer 2 to 3 minutes, uncovered or until shrimp turns pink.

ALL AROUND THE HARBOR

Maintenance repairs on the docks are on-going, and we ask that you let us know of any maintenance items on the docks that need attention. You may do so by leaving us a note in the office, by phoning in, or by sending an e-mail to manager@stocktonsc.org. You as members are our "eyes" in the harbor, and it is your input that keeps us up-to-date on needed repairs.

An area of special attention is that of electrical and GFI outlets. We have begun a routine check on all outlets in the harbor, and we will be checking power cords that are used by boats in the harbor. We take this opportunity to remind you that the Harbor Rules state that power cords are to be unplugged from the power source when the boat is gone and that heaters are not to be left on when no one is on the boat. The rules also state that only 3-wire power cords with a minimum 14-gauge "S" (standard) "W" (outdoor) rating are to be used. This is a minimum requirement; the office has #10 marine-grade power cords available for sale which may provide for a greater load on current.ept

Another area of attention is that of mooring lines. This is a good time of year to check your lines and to also inspect your boat for the coming winter months. The winds in fall and rain in winter come along quickly, and we are doing inspections with safety and security in mind as preparation for the weather. Again, please inform us of any special needs so that we all will be ready to meet the occasion.

There are bilge pads and socks available for your use to keep your bilges clean. Place your dirty bilge pads in the shop area for removal in accordance with our waste management program. There are drums for dirty bilge pads, for discarded oil filters and for recycled waste oil. Thank you for keeping the harbor clean.
