The Rules and Policy Committee hereby recommends the establishment of the: Sailing Program Oversight Committee

Whereas the purposes of the Stockton Sailing Club includes: "to encourage sailing and the science and art of designing, building, navigating and handling of yachts and small boats" and, Whereas members of the Stockton Sailing Club have been successfully conducting sailing programs, and Whereas the financial and liability issues have become substantial, it is therefore recommended that:

***A Sailing Program Oversight Committee shall be established by the Stockton Sailing Club to oversee the development, operation and financial transactions of the following programs and such additional programs as the Stockton Sailing Club shall establish. The Sailing Program Oversight Committee shall be an Advisory Committee to the Board of Directors.***

This committee shall establish as an Advisory Committee to the Board of Directors and shall communicate with and report to the Board through a Board Liaison. The Committee shall elect its chairperson and in all other respects perform as an Advisory Committee as constructed in Article X of the Stockton Sailing Club Bylaws. It shall exceed their approved budgets as established by the Board of Directors. The Committee's activities shall include the following tasks and others that the Board of Directors may determine.

- Advise on boat and equipment purchases in support of club sailing programs.
- Direct sailboat and equipment maintenance.
- Scope, design, coordinate and recommend new programs.
- Oversee the integration of training programs with other SSC activities.
- Recommend program structure, budgets and staffing.
- Review performance and outcomes versus cost and prepare annual reports to the Board of Directors.

For the second time in three years the California Maritime Academy won the US Service Academy Offshore Sailing Championship. **Skipper senior Andy Goodman** driving in his second event at the Naval Academy in Navy 44s will have his name engraved on the prestigious Shields Trophy thanks to the flawless work by the bow team, William "Bud" McKay in the pit, Trevor Bozina at the mast and Paige Johnston on the bow. Nine races were sailed in great sailing conditions on the Chesapeake Bay September 24-25th with breeze ranging from 8 to 12 knots. CMA had a tremendous comeback in the last race on Saturday after being called over early at the start to leading around the second weather mark but the US Merchant Marine Academy, Kings Point, was able to sneak by when Cal Maritime had a halyard breakdown. Tactician Piet Van Os was under pressure to win his second Shields event finishing Saturday's racing tied with last year's winner King Point but losing the tie breaker. Trimmers Nathan Prather, Nathan Woodward and Wade Poor got the boating moving in the first race on Sunday to pass Massachusetts Maritime Academy on the downwind leg, winning the race and taking the lead by 3 points. Mass Maritime was now closing in on Kings Point for second and sailing very well trading positions with CMA several times in the second race while Kings Point faltered towards the back of the fleet.
