Motion to approve all requests in Correspondence with scheduling of the Retreat to be done by the office: Corbin/ Lueck (M.S.P.)

Member and Guest Comments:

Mr. Stefani displayed two new burgees recently presented to SSC: a St. Thomas Yacht Club burgee from Ray and Bonnie Lopez and a Lake Yosemite Sailing Association burgee from an anonymous donor at the Ditch Run.

Old Business:

1. Dredging: Mr. Stefani read the report from Bill Darsie of KSN, the engineering company hired to assist SSC with the permit process. The long-term management strategy (LTS) process is moving along but they are dealing with a slow, bureaucratic system. Mr. Darsie expects to have the LTS process complete in 2010 and possibly use the SSC as a pilot permit project.

2. Accounting conversion: See Facility Manager's Report below.

3. Weed abatement in the harbor: Ms McLain reported that we are inquiring with the proper agencies regarding possible solutions.

4. Ditch Run: See the Facility Manager's Report below.

5. Planning for SSC's 75th Anniversary in September 2008: Ms McLain reported that club members are working on this.

6. Review of PG&E billing statements: Ms McLain is working on a report to determine if recent higher PG&E costs are due to increased electricity rates or increased usage.

New Business:

1. Nor Cal Regatta: The regatta is scheduled for September 15 and 16. John Gutenkunst and Eric Anderson of Bay Area Sailing Youth Sailing (BAYS) have made arrangements to hold the regatta at their second choice, Half Moon Bay, if SSC does not approve the regatta that was planned last year to be held here in 2007. The SSC Board agreed to provide the venue if the parents will provide the legwork—food, crash boats, race committee, etc. that are needed. Peggy Feakes volunteered to assist with the regatta part, Jim Giles agreed to coordinate the entire event, and Jim Hackman offered to be an advisor. Ms Feakes will contact the BAYS group regarding our plans.

2. Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce Mixer: SSC will host this event for the first time this year. It is scheduled for September. Karri Johnson has volunteered to update the brochure that will be distributed at the mixer and will also be used for future mailings for prospective club members.

Facilities Manager's Report: Ms McLain submitted a written report dated June 12, 2007 that the Board reviewed and discussed.

There are currently 31 slip vacancies in the harbor. There are two pending lien sales and three boats for sale in the harbor.

The final accounting for the Ditch Run will be completed soon. There were a lot of positive comments about the entire event from attendees. A meeting will be scheduled to gather input from the volunteers and to thank them profusely.

There was a short in the wiring on D Dock that was repaired by Edgar and Carr Electric. The carpet on A Dock was replaced, and the swim ladder was cleaned and re-installed. There were finger repairs done on E and F Docks.

Crane Pro came back and greased the bearings.

We received three quotes for replacement of hazardous fingers. CA Custom Docks was selected to provide 10 36-foot fingers. Amended motion to purchase a maximum of 10 concrete-top fingers from CA Custom Docks and, if we can negotiate for fewer fingers at the reduced rate, then we will go with that number:

Lueck/Ayala (M.S.P.)

Carl Myers, distributor of Mikron Boards and the contractor for C Dock had been asked to assess the problems with some of the boards on C dock.

The CA Waste Management Board has recertified SSC for 2007-2008 for our waste oil collection program. Ms McLain is now preparing for the "Clean Marina" Certification status, targeted for completion in August. We have a capacity of 250 gallons of waste oil, and we are required to and do offer collection to the public as part of our grant. Then we are reimbursed for about two-thirds of the cost of removal of the waste oil by a certified hazardous waste removal agency. There are additional costs for removal of the socks and pads.

The front gate cards and controller unit have been ordered. The horseshoe pit is back in operation, and numerous other small repairs have been made around the grounds.

The Learn to Sail classes are under way, with the current enrollment at 58% of capacity. We need more students or we could lose money. Parts are being ordered for the Prams and El Toros. Employees and club members have provided the labor for maintenance and repair of the boats.

Planning is underway for sail camp with Richmond Yacht Club on July 9-13.

Our bookkeeper is working with Peter Hine and Moss Adams to set up the new financial reports in Quickbooks. Mr. Hine has contributed greatly to the conversion process.

A rotary sander has been removed from the shop.

Ms McLain and Ms Feakes attended a meeting with the Sheriff's Department and county government. They are considering a local boating ordinance regarding live-aboard vessels and length of time for mooring and anchoring.

Vivian Matuk of the CA Clean Boating Network has cancelled her event at SSC previously scheduled for August. Ms McLain will contact her to reschedule.

Lenora Clark, RBOC Director and DBW commission member, will present information regarding their efforts and accomplishments at the August Board meeting.

Junior Sailing: No report.

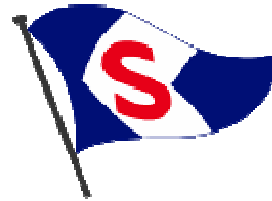
Harbor and Facilities: No report.

UPCOMING BLUE WATER CRUISE NEWS

From the Blue Water Cruise planning meeting that was held on March 10, it appears there is a lot of interest from members who haven't been on the cruise before. Several of these skippers have requested some educational sessions about the navigation challenges that are typically seen on this trip.

In addition, there has been interest on the part of crew on these boats for some info on provisioning, things that make the trip more comfortable, etc. (It used to be so easy and more descriptive to just say "from the first mate" about "cooking aboard", but being PC these days prohibits that, so here we are.)

Anyway, we'll have a meeting on Saturday, May 19, starting at 1000, to go over the following issues, as well as answering any questions that may arise:

1. Charts you'll need.
2. GPS waypoints and using them.
3. Danger spots and areas to avoid.
4. Narrow channels and other "local knowledge" you'll need.
5. Facilities at the harbors, availability of fuel, foodstuffs, laundry, restaurants, etc. (especially Moss Landing.)
6. Weather conditions to expect and how to prepare for them.
7. Getting from Stockton to the Bay for those who haven't been before.
8. Conventions for use of the VHF radio.
9. Raft-up rules and procedures.

This meeting will not be for planning this cruise, per se, but rather for providing information to the relative "newbies" that plan on attending this year's cruise. While all are welcome to attend, if you've "been ther, done that", at the meeting we'd certainly appreciate your input and experience, but it will probably not provide much information that is new to you.

Around the Harbor

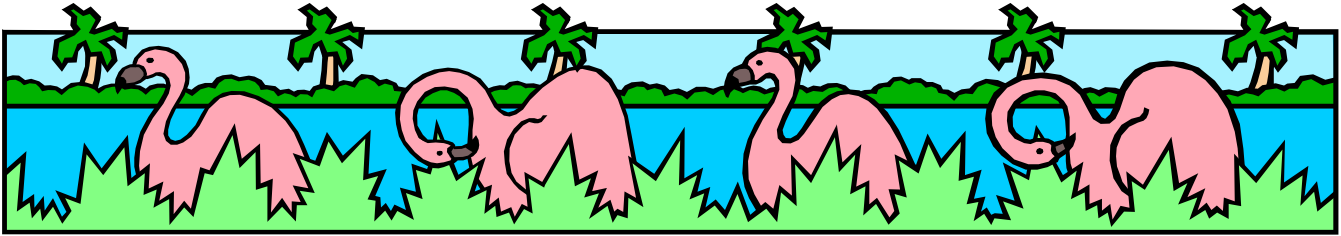

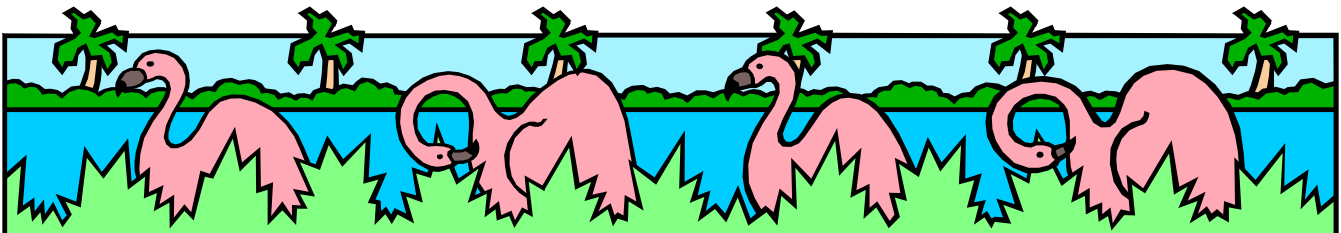
